29. Make a critical review of the essay 'Am I Blue'; by Alice Walker.

Hints: featuring a horse, Blue – powerful reflection on slavery and freedom – empathy for non-human beings – comparison of the black Americans' life with Blue – Inhuman abuse endured by the African – Americans.

30. The poem 'My Last Duchess', ironically reveals the perverse passions and prejudices of the patriarchal society. – Elaborate.

Hints: Victorian hypocrisy – the struggle between religion and science – dramatic monologue – inspiration came from the Duke and Duchess Ferarra – death of the Duchess – Duke's speech with the emissary – Duke's new marriage proposal.

31. How does the author create a picture of an ideal class room in the minds of the reader through his memoir 'Last Day at School'.

Hints: the essay as a memoir – the feelings of a teacher on his last day at school – students like Martinelli, Crippa, Manili, Giordani – Martinelli's confession – Spadoni's trumpeting noise – regrets to wash off toffee marks.

32. 'The Boy Comes Home' is a comedy that shows the conflict between uncle James and Philip. – Justify.

Hints: issues associated with the generation gap – Philip as the representative of the frustrated youth – uncle Jame's strict discipline in the house – argument with Philip – Philip frightens uncle James to death.
