(b) Who are the prospective buyers of bangles ?

(b) Identify the speaker in the poem and the author of the poem.

14. In the poem 'Never Again Would Birds' song be the same' how does the poet establish a close link between birds and Eve ?

23. Please and Thank you are all small changes with which we pay our way as social beings. Explain.
[Hints : positive impressions – manners – courtesy – positive effect]
24. Comment on the relationship between Bess and the highway man.
[Hints : Explores love – idealized devotion – passion – becomes vulnerable]
25. Do you think the speaker in the poem 'To the Cuckoo' is nostalgic ? Elucidate.
[Hints : Childhood days – memories – longing for bird – eagerness]
