## (Questions 31 to 35. Answer any 3 of the following questions in about 200 words. Each carries 8 scores) $(3 \times 8 = 24)$

31. 'Africa' and 'Million Man March' depict voices from two continents revealing the same agony. Discuss.

[Hints: Themes of both poems – the hardships faced by the poets' race-tone of protest and expression of hope in both poems etc.]

32. Write an essay on the contrasting ideas presented by the poet and his mother in the poem 'Ecology'.

[Hints: Theme of the poem – the son's violent reaction to the flowering of the trees – his decision regarding the trees – the mother's opinion – her excuses to save the trees – the differences in their attitude to nature etc.]

33. It is quite painful to be different in a world of 'normal' people. Write an essay on Gregor Samsa's experiences in the light of the above statement.

[Gregor's transformation – Physical hardships faced by him – attitude of his family and others – mental struggles of Gregor – his sense of alientation – his death and the treatment of his dead body by his family etc.]

34. "I sold flowers. I didn't sell myself. Now you've made a lady of me, I'm not fit to sell anything else." Do you agree with these words of Eliza? Justify your answer.

(Hints: Eliza's carefree life as a flower girl – Higgins' efforts to change her – Eliza's transformation – Higgins' lack of consideration for her future – Eliza's confrontation with Higgins – the conclusion of the play etc.)

35. Write an essay on the portrayal of the London Society in 'Pygmalion'.

[Hints: Theme of the play – Eliza's background. Characters of Eliza and Dolittle – representation of the upper class through the characters of Higgins, Pickering, Mrs. Higgins etc. – the upper middle class and their snobbery as portrayed through the Eynesford Hills – Mrs. Pearce as a representative of the working class etc.]
